Dear Praying Friends,

The months of March through June marked the last three months of our first term in Haiti. These months were busy months filled with many stressful and discouraging times as we prepared to leave Haiti. But these four months have also been the most encouraging times of our missionary career since beginning deputation in 2004. In Galatians 6:9 the Lord encourages us by saying, "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not." God graciously allowed us to see some fruits of our labors in Haiti, thereby encouraging us to be faithful to the end and giving us a glimpse of what can be done when we return to Haiti in 2011.

March and April were spent in our regular school and church ministries as well as in the added efforts of ministering to earthquake refugees. We held two more food distributions as well as helped our church members to build on to existing homes in order to provide places for refugees to live. Please continue to pray for those affected by the earthquake.

During the month of May, we celebrated the harvest with both of our church plants. Pastor Chavannes baptized 11 new converts at our first church plant, New Life Baptist Church. We were pleased to see the church totally organizing their harvest festival without any help from us. It was a blessing to see Lovely, a girl I had mentioned in one of our first prayer letters, give testimony to her salvation through water baptism. Pray for Pastor Chavannes as he pastors this church and takes a stand against sin in the area.

I had the privilege of baptizing 8 new converts at our second church plant, Good News Baptist Church. Four of these were two couples in the church who had been living together and took the step to get married in order to be baptized. This is the first time in our ministry that couples have taken this step. We were also able to erect a temporary pole building to serve as a meeting place for the church in our absence. Please pray for two of my Bible Correspondence students who will be caring for the church in our absence.

At Field Day this year, we were able to bring two of our schools together for a day of fun. We had chapel, games, and snacks for over 225 school children. It was a blessing to see them enjoy simple games and prizes. We praise the Lord for over 70 children who accepted the Lord this past year in our three Christian schools.

Since arriving in the States in June, the Lord has blessed us beyond measure. The Lord provided us with a place to stay and a van. We already have a full schedule until Christmas. Please pray that we will be able to schedule meetings for 2011. We are excited to be able to spend time with all of our supporters.
